

REQUEST FOR BIDS

SEALED BIDS will be received by Bell Acres Borough, Allegheny County, 1153 Camp Meeting Road, Sewickley PA 15143, until 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday, September 9, 2026, at which time they will be opened and read aloud. Bids may be considered and awarded at a meeting held by Bell Acres Borough Council on Monday, September 14, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. for the following:

Borough Park Improvements - Phase II 2025-GEDTF-018

Base Bid - Work shall consist of construction of a new asphalt sports court (basketball/pickleball), application of four coat acrylic sports court surface system and other miscellaneous work.

Alternate A - Work shall consist of installing ADA concrete walkways.

Proposals and Bid Documents can be obtained from Shoup Engineering Inc. (724-869-9560) from weekdays, located at 329 Summerfield Drive, Baden, Economy Borough, Pennsylvania 15005 for a non-refundable fee of \$100.00, payable to Shoup Engineering prior to distribution. You must call ahead.

Proposals must be submitted upon the original forms furnished by the Borough.

Pennsylvania Prevailing minimum wage rates will apply.

Each Bidder must submit a bid bond or cashier's check as bid security in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the bid amount made payable to the Borough. No bids may be withdrawn within sixty (60) days after the date of opening.

A Performance Bond and a Payment Bond in the amount of 100% of the bid amount, and an 18-month Maintenance Bond in the amount of 10% of the contract amount will be required.

Bell Acres Borough reserves the right to reject any or all bids either in whole or in part, to waive any informalities, and to alter the scope of work.

Compliance is required with the Pennsylvania Prevailing Wage Act of 1961, P.L. 987, No. 442; Title VI and other applicable provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; the Department of Labor Equal Opportunity Clause (41 CFR 60 -1.4); Executive Order 11625 (Utilization of Minority Business Enterprise); Executive Order 12138 (Utilization of Female Business Enterprise); in compliance with Section 504 of Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; the Allegheny County MBE/WBE Program enacted July, 1981, which set forth goals of 13 percent Minority and 2 percent Female Business Enterprise; and the Allegheny County Ordinance #6867-12, setting forth goals of 5 percent Veteran-Owned Small Businesses.
