Geoff Bland, the Pittsburgh community organizer for Clean Water Action, will discuss the risks to public and private water sources and will talk about what happens when a family's private well is contaminated.

Dr. John Stoltz, Ph.D., Director of the Center for Environmental Research and Education at Duquesne University, will give a detailed presentation on the risks of water contamination from fracking, and he will also provide information on how to have your private well water tested.

Rosemary Stewart, of Citizens to Protect the Ambridge Reservoir (CPAR) and Communities First, will discuss the threat of Shell's Falcon gas pipeline to the Ambridge Reservoir, the source of drinking water for 30,000 people in Bell Acres, Edgeworth, Leet Township and Leetsdale, and five other municipalities in Beaver County.
