

The Department of Environmental Protection Public Hearing on the Shell Falcon Pipeline is April 5th, 6:30-8:30 pm, at the Quaker Valley Middle School Auditorium.

Sign up to speak now. If you don't wish to speak, please just show up for the meeting to show your support for the Ambridge Water Authority, which provides Bell Acres' public water and does not want the ethane pipeline to run through the watershed of the Ambridge Reservoir. The proposed pipeline route will cross watershed tributaries 13 times and will cross the main raw water line leading out of the reservoir.

Pipeline construction puts public water sources as well as private water wells at risk. Two other PA pipeline projects have been shut down because of construction permit violations, water contamination, safety issues, and the development of sinkholes exposing pipeline.
