MAYOR'S REPORT

The Mayor's Report for the month of February has been submitted in writing and made a part of the minutes.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

A motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on February 11, 2019, was made by Mr. Renfrew and seconded by Mr. Meanor. All in favor. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

A motion to approve the Treasurer's Report for February 2019 as distributed and ratify payments totaling \$114,691.86 out of the General Fund and \$15,968.96 out of the State Fund, was made by Mr. Wagner and seconded by Mr. Renfrew. All in favor. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

SWIFT 911

Mayor Alvania stated that the Swift 911 System is up and running. Mayor Alvania reported that the emergency notification system has already been used when the Borough experienced high winds. He stated that the system informed the residents that a warming center was open at the fire hall. Mayor Alvania explained how the system works, how to register, and that a postcard will be mailed to all the residents in order to inform them of the mass emergency notification system.

OTHER OLD BUSINESS

SEVIN ROAD

Mr. Young discussed the Sevin Road landslide. Mr. Kulbacki stated that this situation has been discussed quite often with Scott Shoup, the Road Department and Lewis Hopkins. Mr. Kulbacki stated that it will take approximately \$21,000 to fix the road. He also advised that the project does not need to be put out for bid because it will be repaired in increments with the Borough employees and the services of Lewis Hopkins. Furthermore, Mr. Kulbacki advised that the Borough will purchase the material through COG and Floyd Wine will donate busted-up concrete, which will all occur on Borough property.

A motion to expend Mr. Kulbacki to \$21,000 or less to fix the Sevin Road landslide was made by Mr. Wagner and seconded by Mr. Abell.

Mr. Young stated that since this item was not on the Agenda, he asked for Public Comment.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Harry Lavelle - 1667 Big Sewickley Creek Road
 Mr. Lavelle said that he has lived in the Borough since 1939 and he thinks Sevin Road should be open to the people. Mr. Young stated that only the lower half is being fixed because the top half is too expensive to fix.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) - INVESTMENT ADVISORY SERVICES FOR THE BOROUGH'S POLICE AND NON-UNIFORMED PENSION PLANS

Mrs. Veeck reiterated that Morgan Stanley recently informed us that they will no longer provide professional investment services to the Borough's Police and Non-Uniform Pension Plans. She stated that the Borough advertised and sent out RFP's and received 9 proposals. The Committee narrowed it down to two investment firms. The award selection was based on the criteria of cost, experience and ease to conduct business. After much due diligence, Mrs. Veeck announced that the Committee recommends that Oakmont Capital Management, LLC provide professional investment services.

A motion to hire Oakmont Capital Management, LLC to handle the Professional Investment Services of the Borough's Police and Non-Uniform Pension Plan was made by Mr. Wagner and seconded by Mr. Renfrew. All in favor. Motion carried.

Mr. Young thanked the Committee and Mrs. Veeck extended her thanks and appreciation to Mr. Wagner, Mr. Renfrew, Mr. Kulbacki and Mrs. Fleming.
